Ingredients; 175g plain flour, 25g butter, 25g sugar, 1 egg, 100g dates, 225g honey, pinch of salt, 5tbs boiling water, 1/2 tsp bicarbonate of soda
Preparation:- grease 1lb loaf tin, stone and chop dates and pour boiling water over them. Dissolve bicarbonate of soda in water drained from the dates. Beat egg, sift dry ingredients, rub in butter, add sugar, make well in the centre and add egg, water, dates and honey. Mix thoroughly and turn into prepared loaf tin, Bake in a moderate oven for about 1 hour.
69. A Honey Label. A standard label of your own design, actual size, to fit on a standard 227g, 340g or 454g jar (8oz, 12oz or 1lb jar) produced in any medium, and displayed on an empty honey jar.
70. Any Artistic, Decorative or Instructive Exhibit, relating to Bees and Beekeeping. Maximum size 600mm x 600mm
